- 1. Call to Order – Danny Elsner, Dewberry**
 - A. Main Focus – 2025 Budget approval
 - B. 2025 Yearly Plan creation - Danny provided an overview the 2025 Yearly Plan can be found under the events tab on the CASFM website

- 2. Secretary – Jeremy Deischer, ICON**
 - A. Check for quorum - A quorum of the board was present with Danny Elsner (Chair), Jen Winters (Vice-Chair), Jeremy Deischer (Secretary), Melanie Walter (Metro Rep) present in person. Frans Lambrechtsen (Treasurer), Andrew Fisher (NE Rep), and Jordan Becker (SE Rep) present remote.
 - B. Approval of last meetings minutes - The meeting minutes were approved without comment.

- 3. Treasurer’s Report – Frans Lambrechtsen, Kimley-Horn**
 - A. 2024 Profit & Loss/Cash Flow Update - Frans reviewed the attached P&L and Cash Flow Update. All conference expenses have been paid at this time, as well as dispersing the scholarship funds to the award recipients. The ending balance was ~\$227,000 which is approximately \$100,000 higher than the previous year as the organization continues to aim to build the surplus to support ongoing efforts.
 - B. 2025 Draft Budget Approval - The most notable change since the previous general membership meeting was the increase of the conference expenses from \$250,000 to \$285,000 and the annual conference general from \$20,000 to \$30,000. Jason Messamer provided an update these number include a 10% contingency for the conference budget. A vote was held to approve the 2025 budget, which passed unanimously with the seven present board members: Danny Elsner, Jen Winters, Frans Lambrechtsen, Jeremy Deischer, Melanie Walter, Jordan Becker, and Andrew Fisher.
 - C. New accountant - CASFM has contracted with a new accounting firm with more experience working with non-profits to consolidate the financial services previously held by multiple firms.

 - A. Highlight Regional and Committee Reports - Jen Winters summarized the winter newsletter that had been published which can be found on the CASFM website ([Link to Winter Newsletter](#)). Dan Hill summarized membership was ahead of overall numbers and renewals from last year. Currently, the organization has 1300 members, and around 90% renewed for the year.

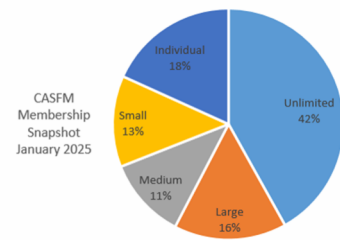
Membership: Stuart Gardner, CDOT (stuart.gardner@state.co.us) and Dan Hill (dhill@mhfd.org)

- Total Membership Revenue for 2024 was \$50,430 - 11% over 2023.
- The total number of members is up. In spite of strong renewals in November and December, the renewal percentage is a little behind last year at 88% compared to 94%.
- A few of the bundles are late renewing due to Bundle Admins leaving their organization and not arranging for a replacement.
